




Instructions

The Very Hungry Caterpillar loves to eat lots of different foods. What is your favourite food? Draw a picture of your favourite food and write a sentence to tell us about it.

In the story The Very Hungry Caterpillar eats some different foods each day. Can you remember the seven days of the week? Draw a picture or write a sentence about something you do each day.

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Try some of the different fruits mentioned in the story. Which one is your favourite? You could try some apples, pears, strawberries, oranges, plums or watermelon. You could also try some other fruits – what other fruit might The Very Hungry Caterpillar like to eat?

> The Very Hungry Caterpillar eats 4 strawberries and 5 oranges. How many pieces of fruit did he eat altogether? You could use your fingers or draw a picture to help you.
