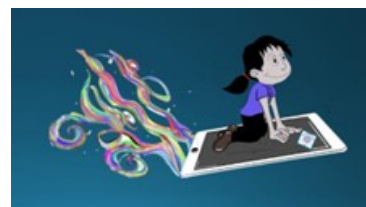

Digital Lift Off- Friday 23rd April

You will have seen in Mr Hughes' letter to parents before the Easter break that this Friday we are having a Digital Lift Off which launches our plan to bring more one to one devices to our children and enhance technology across school. On Friday the children will be asked to dress in bright colours to signify their bright future as well as donate £1 to help with starting off our technology fund.



The first step is to provide all our Y3 to Y6 children with a personal iPad, funded by the Trust and charitable donations, to use for learning at school and home. For our younger children they will have increased access to technology in school before extending our one to one home-school device offer. All our staff are also accessing high quality training to ensure we have the skills needed too!

Why is this important?

Put simply, we know that having the skills and confidence to use technology will not only help our children learn but will also be an important **key to their future success**.

Hackwood Primary Growth Update

It seems a long time ago that our first 50 children started at Hackwood in September 2019. From September 2021 Hackwood will be a 1 form entry academy from Year 1 to Year 5 and in September 2022 we will have opened all classes, including Year 6. We had a very high level of interest for reception places for September and are pleased that our reception class will be full. We are also sorry that some of our nursery children did not get a place.

As we have had a Year 1 and 2 mixed class this year and are moving to separate classes this means that we will have spaces in Year 2 and Year 3 from September. We also still have a few spaces in our current Year 3 and 4 and have enjoyed providing a warm welcome to some new children this week.
