English / Phonics	Maths
<p>Listen to stories about dinosaurs. I really enjoyed listening to these: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OF7FzzHk0Yo https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IggO95n595Y&t=3s</p> <p>Maybe you could compare the two stories or write which one you liked more using 'because'. Remember to use all the correct punctuation in your writing too!</p>	<p>Write the numbers 0-20 in words and digits.</p> <p>(Year 2s, you could go up to 30 or maybe even 50 if you think this is too easy)</p> <p>Practise counting up in 2s, 5s and 10s. <p>Draw your own dragon and write about what you do together. What is your dragons name? Where does he come from? Can you write a really good description of him?</p>	<p>Tell a family member everything you know about addition. This can include pictures/diagrams etc. Make it as creative as you want!</p> <p>Get someone to test you on your rapid recall of number bonds or addition facts e.g. what is $18 + 3$? $20 + 5$? How many do you get right in 1 minute, 2 minutes, 3 minutes?</p>
<p>Talk about reading and writing words with the alternative pronunciations of 'ea' (like in bread and meat) and 'er' on https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk username -> march20 password -> home</p>	<p>Use the link below to access Hit the Button - focus on number bonds and doubling for this week. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</p>
<p>Keep practising reading, writing and spelling those 'tricky' words I have given you. Maybe you could even practise making and writing sentences using them?</p>	<p>Work on a shopping list for the weekly shop and add up how many items you're getting.
