## Hedgehogs - Week 3

### English / Phonics

This week I would like you to focus on noun phrases. Have a look at [this video](#) and then what I have put on **page 3**.

The information on page 3 will help you recap any words you're not sure about. Then you could log in to your **Purple Mash** account and complete the 'making phrases interesting' 2do. You could even write some of your own noun phrases.

Practise reading and writing trick words this week. Focus on the words *many, laughed, because, different, any and eyes*. Can you use them in sentences too?

Once you've done that you could go on to book trust website I've attached on page 1 and read a book.

Family activity - Find a mirror in the house. What can you see? Imagine you able to walk into the mirror. What do you think you would see? Listen to the story '[Through the Magic Mirror](#)' by [Anthony Browne](#).

Can you plan a story similar to 'Through the Mirror'? Draw a story map first on paper if you want (an example of a story map is on **page 3** - it's the Guy Fawkes map).

Log in to your **Purple Mash** account and complete the 'My short Magic Mirror story 2do. You will need to draw your character and write short sentences on what they will see when they go through the mirror. I cannot wait to read these! You can do it on paper if you can't log in.

### Topic

1. Research different dinosaurs and compare them to each other. This could be a written comparison, poster, venn diagram, labelled photos or drawn pictures. What is similar and what is different?
2. Make a mind map of everything you remember about the religion of Judaism. Then, get a grown up to show you how to research more facts about Judaism and add this information to the mind map.

### Maths

Get a grown up to show you all the coins and notes in their purse/wallet/at home. Can you name them all? Are there any you're not sure about? Can you count it all up?

This is a [quick refresher video](#) on the coins you might find at home.

Log in to your **Purple Mash** account and complete the Maths 2do's titled 'shop with coins' and the 'coins pairs game'.

This is not money related but very fun. Practise making different shapes on this [online geoboard](#) or on paper if you can't access it. How many can you make?

Choose **5 numbers between 0 - 50**. Make a poster showing how many different ways you can represent the numbers using coins. You could draw the coins out or stick real ones down! I could show £5 by drawing a £5 note, 5 £1 coins or 10 50p coins. There are lots more ways too. I could even have 2 £2 coins and 1 £1 coin. How many ways can you show £10?

### Creative/craft

1. Do you have any dinosaurs at home? You could make your own dinosaur fossils using [these instructions](#) to help.



2. Paint and jazz up your fossils! I know I'd love to see some glittery blue T-Rex fossils - wouldn't you?

## What are Noun Phrases?

### Adjectives

**Adjectives** describe **nouns**.

**Adjectives** can come beside the **noun**.

The dragon What sort of dragon?

**Adjectives** can complete a sentence.

The huge, terrifying dragon Go on...

The huge, terrifying dragon felt...

How did the dragon feel?

Can you spot the adjectives?

The huge, terrifying dragon felt puzzled.  
The **huge, terrifying** dragon felt **puzzled**.



### Adverbs

Adverbs add to adjectives – they tell us more about the description.

The **silly** dragon...

The **smart** princess...

How **silly** is the dragon?

How **smart** is the princess?

Now try it yourself!



We can choose an adverb.

**extremely**

**very**

**unusually**

**really**

**exceptionally**

**quite**

Now we can finish the sentence.

The **extremely silly** dragon tired himself out.

The **really smart** princess outwitted the dragon.

### Noun phrases

Highlight the adjective

Highlight the adverb

**Noun phrase = the words giving more detail about a noun**

A **dragon**

What is the noun being described?

Which dragon?

A **dragon** in the sky

Where?

A **dragon** in the sky over the mountains

Tell me more about the dragon

A **scary dragon** in the sky over the mountains

There was a **really scary dragon** in the sky over the mountains.



Writing Noun Phrases

#### Examples

Start with a noun

girl

Add adjectives

a happy, laughing girl

Add adverbs

an extremely happy, laughing girl

Add phrases about where and when

an extremely happy laughing girl in the garden

Do this for three different characters, creatures or things.

Then write a short paragraph about your three chosen things or creatures.

You can be as imaginative as you want!



The scary hungry green dragon in the high and rather snowy mountains flew toward the almost empty house in the valley.

### Noun phrase

A dragon

A dragon on the mountain

A very scary dragon on the mountain above the town.

Now you have a go...

Start with a noun.

Add description about what, where or when.

Add adjectives and adverbs.
