


## Home Learning



### 'Gorilla'



Imagine a gorilla says he is going to visit your house.


Can you draw them a picture telling them lots of information about your home?

### Number

Can you practise your number bonds to 5, to 10 and to 20

For example -

$$1 + 4 = 5 \quad 2 + 3 = 5$$

$$1 + 9 = 10 \quad 2 = 8 + 10$$

$$1 + 19 = 20 \quad 2 + 18 = 20.$$

### Number

☐

Can you make your own number cards to 5 10 or 20 and play number snap? Take care to form your numbers correctly.

### Shape, space and measures

☐

Can you make a repeat pattern with your lego bricks or draw and colour shapes.

### Number

☐

Can you play snakes and ladders?

Take turns and count your jumps carefully, try to miss the snakes. Have fun!

### Data collection

Look out of your window. Count the colour of the cars that go past. Can you make a record?

### Shape, space and measures

Look at all of the shapes around your house. Can you talk about them?
