


Owls Home Learning 29th June




Read/watch and discuss the story: 'The Night Pirates'

Can you draw out a story map showing the key events of the story?


Can you include important information at key events?



Discussion points

1. Watch/Read the first few pages... 'Quiet as mice' is a simile. Can you find more similes in this book or in other books? Can you make up your own similes?
2. Discuss what 'stealthy' means. Can you think of any animals that are stealthy?
3. The text on each page is arranged in an unusual way. Can you think of reasons why the author has done this?
4. Try to explain why the author has include so many repeated words / phrases on each page.


Think of exciting adjectives to describe the treasure in the chest. Can you challenge yourself and include some similes? – use the worksheet on page 10 of home learning pack



Think of exciting adjectives to use and use your imagination. What's inside? Are there jewels, money, gold, diamonds, chocolates or money? What words describe these items well and what could they be used for?

Write about the adventures you would take your crew on if you were a pirate—use the worksheet on page 13 of home learning pack.


What countries would you visit? What food would you eat? How would you stay in touch with your family if there's no internet?
