What is the weather like today? Talk to your grown up about the weather and what you might need to wear in this weather. Record the weather on the weather chart provided further down this document. You could cut and stick the weather picture on or you could have a go at drawing it yourself. Your grown-ups might need to show you where to draw/stick your picture.</p> <p>Physical activity: Make sure you are keeping your body and brain active everyday with at least 20 minutes of physical activity. Reading	<p>Try to read a book everyday with your grown-up. This could be one that you have on your book shelf at home, one that you make up and act out with puppets/teddies or your school reading book.</p> <p>Miss Dudson's favourite book is 'Zog' by Julia Donaldson. What is your favourite book?</p> <p>Can you discuss your favourite book? Who is in your book? Who are the characters? What is the best part of the book?</p>	

<p>Maths</p>	<p><u>Number work:</u> Our focus number this week is 4. Below are a few activities that you can do to learn what the number 4 looks like and counting to 4. Try to do one of these activities every day.</p> <p>Physical counting tasks - Can you do 4 jumps? Can you do 4 hops? Can you get me 4 toys/books/teddies? Can you show me 4 fingers?</p> <p>Number hunt – See how many number 4's you can find! Look around your house, on road signs when you go for a walk. If you can't find any number 4's around your house, you could have a go at writing them yourself and place them around your house for your grown up to find!</p> <p>Gingerbread Man Game – Play this fun counting game! Can you count out different amounts, using grapes, cereal or building blocks or use other small items from around the house. Can you count out 2 different amounts? Have you got more? Less? the same? in each hand.</p> <p><u>Thursday</u> Can you have fun measuring in the kitchen? You will need a bowl, a cup and different size spoons. Investigate how many of each spoon it takes to fill a container? You can use sand, water or flour. How many of each? Which size spoon was the best?</p> <p><u>Friday</u> Sing the days of the week song. Sing the months of the year. Can you say the seasons?</p>

Talk to your grown-ups about the seasons. Can you remember what any of them were? Can you tell your grown up what the weather is like in winter and summer? What is your favourite season? What could you wear in the different seasons? Why?
