# Remote learning Wider Opportunities – 11<sup>th</sup> January 2021



#### Instrument trivia

Each week, this section will look at some interesting facts about musical instruments. I will start off this half term by looking at String Instruments. This week we are going to take a look at the biggest of them all; the Octobass!

Full size Double Basses are 2 metres tall, but an Octobass is around 3 ½ metres tall! That is almost twice as tall as me.

How many times taller than you is an octobass?

The lowest note is 15 notes lower than the lowest note on a cello. That's actually lower than the human ear can hear!!
