Think carefully about writing instructions on how to plant a seed.

Look back at the list of sequencing words you made yesterday.

Can you use them to start each new sentence? Some of them you may want to use more than once.

Here is an example for Reception.

- 1. First get a pot
- 2. Put in the soil.
- 3. Next, add the seed.
- 4. Water it.

Here is an example for year 1.

- 1. First, get a pot and put in the soil.
- 2. Next, make a hole and add the seed.
- 3. Then cover the seed with soil.
- 4. After that, water the plant.
- 5. Finally put the pot on a windowsill.
- 6. Make sure that you water it daily.

Get on your dancing shoes and follow the moves to the 'Dinosaur Stomp':




