

What has been found?

- Scientists say they have found an ancient painting in Indonesia.
- Experts say it could be the earliest example in history of people painting stories.

Oldest Story Found in Indonesia

It's said that a picture paints a thousand words! Well, one painting could help us find out more about the past. Scientists say it's the oldest example of a story.

In the journal 'Nature', they say the painting is around 44,000 years old. The painting is in a limestone cave on the island of Sulawesi, Indonesia. Indonesia is a country of around 17,000 islands, between the Indian and Pacific Oceans.

The painting shows supernatural creatures and people hunting warty pigs and dwarf buffaloes.

"It's quite amazing," said Maxime Aubert, an archaeologist from Griffith University, Australia. He also said: "it's the first time we see that in rock art".

So what was life like when the painting was made 44,000 years ago? It was created during a time called the Stone Age.

It's called this because humans made weapons and tools from stone then. It lasted for a long time.

> The painting in Sulawesi was made in the Palaeolithic era. There was when humans lived in caves. They moved around to hunt for food and did not live in the same place all the time.

The team of scientists are trying to protect this fragile painting. The limestone on the cave is crumbling.

There are around 240 caves in Sulawesi. Experts think these could tell us more about our distant past.






Stone Age Survival - Seasons Wheel

Draw or stick a picture of the food you gathered or hunted on to the correct season an the plate.


- + In which seasons were you able to gather the greatest variety of food?

TONE AGE Stewed Fruit Recipe




You will need... 500g blueberries 500g blackberries 200g hazelnuts 6 tbsp honeycomb

a stove a large pan wooden spoon a ladle table spoon



- Add the blueberries to the pan.
- Add the blackberries to the blueberries. Using a wooden spoon mix them together - make sure you do this gently so you don't crush the fruit.
- 3. Add the hazelnuts and carefully mix it all together.
- Add the honeycomb and transfer the pan to the stove (you might need to ask an adult for help with this). Bring the mixture gently to the boil.
- Simmer the mixture very carefully for 20mins. Leave to cool then transfer to a serving bawl.


