	Phonics Don't forget, phonics is all about using your listening ears!	Maths Patterns	Topic 'Animal Kingdom'
Monday	<p><b><u>Playing with words</u></b></p> <p>Gather together a set of familiar objects with names that have varying syllable patterns (e.g. pencil, umbrella, camera, xylophone). Show the objects to the children, name them and talk about what they are used for. Then encourage them to think about how the name of the object sounds and feels as they say it. Think about the syllables and clap them out as you say each word. As your child gains confidence try some long words like binoculars, telephone, dinosaur. How many claps are in your name?</p>	<p>Make a short repeating pattern using two different objects (they can be two different colours or two completely different things). Ask your child what comes next?</p> <p>Use your finger to point to each part of the pattern and say what it is. This will help you work out what you need next. For example, "red, blue, red, blue, red, blue... RED!" or "fork, spoon, fork, spoon, fork, spoon... FORK!".</p> 	<p>Listen to The Very Hungry Caterpillar book. <a href="https://youtu.be/IGhuwLk8rZ4">https://youtu.be/IGhuwLk8rZ4</a></p> <p>What did the caterpillar eat in the book? What do you think a real caterpillar would eat?</p> <p>Real caterpillars eat plants and leaves. They eat and eat until they get really big and fat!</p>
Tuesday	<p><b><u>Odd one out</u></b></p> <p>Today you will need Phonics Sheet 1.</p> <p>Put out three of the pictures, two with names that rhyme and one with a name that does not. Ask your child to identify the 'odd one out': the word that does not rhyme. Start with a small set of words that can then be extended. For example, use the pictures of the frog, dog and umbrella. Then the apple, frog and dog. Once they are secure with those rhyming words, you can move onto another set of rhyming words.</p>	<p>Today you will need Maths Sheet 5.</p> <p>Can you finish the pattern on the scarfs? Make sure you point to and say each colour name as you go along the scarf, this will help you work out which colour comes next.</p>	<p>Can you get crafty today and make your very own caterpillar? You will need an egg box and some paint or colouring pens. You can draw the eyes on or stick on some paper eyes if you do not have googly eyes.</p> 

<b>Wednesday</b>	<p><b><u>Listen to the beat</u></b></p> <p>Use a variety of percussion instruments or instruments that you have made at home (e.g. a bowl and spoon or two spoons). Remind the children to use their listening ears and to play in time to the beat and in time with the lady in the video - <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Us8BR_6edmE">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Us8BR_6edmE</a></p> <p>It might be helpful to play an instrument alongside your child so that you can show them how to play it to the beat.</p>	<p>Have a go at this online patterns game. <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-sequencing/shape-patterns">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-sequencing/shape-patterns</a></p>	<p>Below I have attached some pencil control sheets (that are linked to The Very Hungry Caterpillar book) There are lots of different ones for you to have a go at. You do not have to do them all, they are just there for you to choose from and have a go at doing in any spare moments you have throughout the week.</p>
<b>Thursday</b>	<p><b><u>Making trumpets</u></b></p> <p>Make amplifiers (trumpet shapes) from simple cones of paper or lightweight card and experiment by making different noises through the cones. Model sounds for the children: the up and down wail of a siren, the honk of a fog horn, a cheep, cheep, cheep of a bird. Contrast loud and soft sounds.</p> <p>Talk about which is your favourite sound and why.</p> <p>You can also use the trumpet to practice saying your name and emphasising the first sound in your name, e.g. “b-b-b-b-bob”.</p>	<p>Today you will need Maths Sheet 6. Just like on Tuesday, I would like you to make a pattern on the scarves. But this time, it is your job to make the pattern up yourself! Pick two colours for each scarf to start with and if you’re getting really good at patterns, you can have a go with three!</p>	<p>Listen to ‘The Very Hungry Caterpillar’ again. <a href="https://youtu.be/lGhuwLk8rZ4">https://youtu.be/lGhuwLk8rZ4</a></p> <p>Talk to your grown-up about what happened to the caterpillar. If you have this book at home you can look at the pictures carefully and see each stage of a caterpillar’s life and what happens to it as it grows.</p> <p>Egg → Caterpillar → Chrysalis → Butterfly</p> <p>Some of these words are tricky to say, have a go at saying them and keep practicing them.</p> <p>When you come back to nursery, we are going to have our very own butterfly garden in the classroom, so we can watch the caterpillars grow into a butterfly!</p>
