HACKWOOD'S ANTI – BULLYING MESSAGE

Earlier this term we took part in the National Anti-Bullying campaign called Reach Out. The children at Hackwood engaged well with the campaign and discussed how to recognise bullying and what to do about it if they ever came across it. After working with pupils and staff we decided to adopt our own slogans to ensure that everyone at Hackwood was happy and never have to experience bullying.

We wanted to make sure children were clear and consistent when recognising bullying so we decided on the following:

What is Bullying?

When someone harms another (physically, emotionally or online) <u>Several times on purpose</u>. (STOP)

How to STOP Bullying

Start telling other people (Adults in school or home, friends and other services)

Both the acronyms STOP will facilitate ease of understanding for the children and help us to make sure Hackwood continues to be a bully free zone! We ask that you use these acronyms so that we can have a shared approach.
