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# HOME - SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

I am sure you are aware, communication between school and home is vital. To ensure effective communication we will be using the following means:

 Parent Pay – this will be used for everything that involves payments (School dinners, Breakfast Club, After-School Clubs)



- School Spider App this will be used for communicating ALL other messages (Newsletters, Events, Curriculum, School closures and any other updates)
- Seesaw this will be used by class teachers to share your child's learning journey and share some of the work that they produce.
- It is vital that you have access to these to keep up to date. If

## School Uniform

We expect all children to have the correct uniform:

- A purple sweatshirt or cardigan (available with logo)
- Grey or black trousers / skirt / pinafore dress

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## **Attendance – September 2024**

A reminder about timings:

#### Science








Samuel Pepys wrote a diary, which is how we know so much about the Great Fire of London.
