INSPIRE Curriculum

It has been another fantastic term full of learning across the curriculum in all year groups!

Find out how we have been INSPIRED:

Investigate: Woodpeckers class have investigated mechanisms and made their own moving dinosaur with a mechanism.

Nurture: Woodpeckers Class visited Peak Wildlife Park, where they fed some of the animals.

Skills: Owls Class have developed their persuasive writing skills by writing excellent persuasive adverts to advertise the chocolate bars they made in DT lessons!

Practical: Year 4 visited Derby Museum as part of their invaders and settlers learning. They handled artefacts and learnt about a Viking burial and developed their practical skills by making a replica of Thor's hammer out of clay.

Imaginative: Year 2 have written excellent fictional recounts in role as Florence Nightingale this term. They used their history learning to write an effective diary entry recounting Florence Nightingale's impact.

Reflect: Owls Class reflected during their class visit to All Saints Church in Mickleover. During their visit, Owls reflected on the objects in the church and some children even had the chance to play the organ in the church!

Enjoy: Year 5 and 6 enjoyed their school trip to the Houses of Parliament. They participated in a guided tour, observed MPs debating in the House of Commons and watched a discussion in the House of Lords. After their tour, the children participated in a workshop, were they imagined they were MPs and had their own debate!

Staying Safe Online

Over the past half term, we have had a few incidents of issues caused, outside of school, by children using social media, such as Snapchat and Instagram, and messaging apps, such as WhatsApp. All these apps have an age restriction of 13 years of age (WhatsApp, until April 2014, was 16!), therefore none of the children currently at Hackwood should officially be on them.

There are some social media apps which are designed specifically for younger children. A selection of these are shown here, however we would still recommend that you check these out for yourself before your child goes on them.



We recognise how important a part of life technology is now, but we do also recognise its inherent dangers. As part of our online safety lessons, we talk to the children about only using appropriate apps and about informing trusted adults about what you are doing. If this can be reiterated at home, then the children will know that the message is the same everywhere.
