INSPIRE Curriculum

This term has been full of inspiring learning across the school, with plenty of exciting enrichment opportunities that have brought pupils' learning to life.

Nursery and Reception have really enjoyed this term learning about different types of mini-beasts, through their 'Minibeasts' and 'In the Garden,' topic. They have looked at a wide range of stories and factual books about bees, butterflies and ladybirds. Their favourite story is about a bear that wants to become a bee called 'Bumblebear,' Nursery children really enjoyed their visit from 'Jungle Jo' who brought along her pet tarantula, millipede and hissing cockroaches!

Year I had a fantastic time at Bolsover Castle. They enjoyed dressing up in costumes and exploring the castle grounds. In DT lessons, they have designed and made their own castles, using their history learning to help them create excellent designs.

Year 2 have enjoyed learning about the British seaside in their history lessons. They have investigated how the seaside has changed over time and enjoyed reading 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. Hedgehogs have written their own imaginative journey stories inspired by 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'.

Year 3 have enjoyed learning about Ancient Egypt and the River Nile. They visited Derby Museum where they took part in a workshop to learn about mummification and the afterlife. During their trip, they saw a real Egyptian mummy and a 3000-year-old Shabti statue, Year 3 also learnt about the importance of the River Nile and why it was called the 'River of Life'.

Year 4 have enjoyed their rainforest learning and have investigated the animals and plants that live in the Amazon rainforest. This term, they have learnt about the impact of deforestation and written persuasive letters to raise awareness,

Year 5 performed part of 'The Tempest' at Derby Theatre as part of the Shakespeare Festival. Badgers Class also visited Cromford Mill and enjoyed learning about the Industrial Revolution and finding out (and having a go at!) some of the jobs people did at the time.

Year 6 have continued to show that they are expert learners by using their science learning to write effective non-chronological reports about the circulatory system. Falcons Class also visited Derby University and left with an understanding of what University is like and aspirations for the future!

We know that next year's learning will INSPIRE and excite our pupils and we look forward to another fantastic year full of learning and enrichment opportunities.


Our Year 6 pupils had an unforgettable time on their recent residential trip, where they took on a variety of exciting challenges, including abseiling, raft building, climbing, and zip lining, all while showing incredible courage and teamwork.

The children also enjoyed a memorable campfire, where everyone spent time together to reflect on the trip's adventures. Throughout the trip, the children displayed excellent behaviour and a positive attitude towards all of the challenging activities, pushing themselves out of their comfort zones and supporting one another. It was a truly fantastic experience for everyone involved - what a brilliant









This has been an incredibly successful year of learning at Hackwood, with pupil outcomes surpassing the national average. Through a combination of quality-first teaching, a supportive environment, a strong focus on individual progress, and positive partnership between school and home, pupils have not only achieved but exceeded!

76% of our EYFS pupils have achieved a good level of development in their Early Learning Goals. Hackwood pupils get off to a flying start in Squirrels and Rabbits class which sets the foundations for their future success.

87% of our Year I pupils passed the Year I phonics screening check, compared to 70% nationally.
Reading is a priority at Hackwood and our pupils are able to read and enjoy books and stories because
of their strong phonics knowledge.

48% of our Year 4 pupils achieved a maximum score of 25 on their Year 4 multiplication check compared to 39% nationally. Times tables are an essential part of maths and Hackwood pupils have fluent times table knowledge which allows them to achieve.

Our KS2 SATs results this year are incredible! Our Year 6 pupils have worked incredibly hard during their time at Hackwood and persevered in their learning - their results are certainly something to be proud of! Falcons Class have believed in themselves, achieved their goals and succeeded and we are so proud of them all. Our KS2 SATs results are below:





At school, they have shared their excitement about this topic by writing vivid castle setting descriptions and their own acrostic poems, using creative language to bring their writing to life.

We are also incredibly proud of how well our Year I children have done in their phonics screening checks. They have worked their socks off to achieve a fantastic 87% pass rate! It was wonderful to see their hard work pay off and to watch their faces light up as they realized how much progress they have made this year. In computing, they had a blast learning how to program animations using Scratch Ir. The children learned about algorithms and simple coding skills while showing off their creativity at the same time!

Thank you for all your support this year - from reading together at home, attending INSPIRE open afternoons, holding conversations on the door, to coming on trips with us. It's been a joyful year of learning and growth, and we couldn't have done it without you. Enjoy a restful summer break and thank you for making this such a great year!






Hackwood PTA - Summer Fair and events
