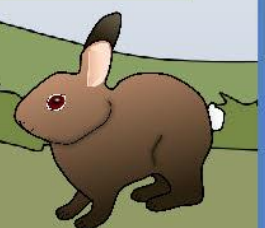
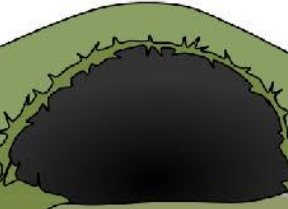
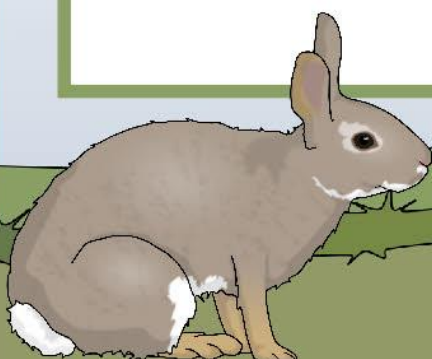

Can you write your own fairy-tale story? You can make up and draw your own characters.

Try to make it as exciting as possible. Remember that you need a beginning, a middle and an end to your story.

You could write a little each day. Read it through and check your writing make sense.

You could start with Once upon a time and end with and they all lived happily ever after.

I have also put a story creator on Purple Mash for you to draw and write your own story on the computer if you would prefer. You do not need to do both but can do if you wish.

Maths

Can you make your own shop?

What kind of shop would you like it to be?

EG. You could be an ice-cream shop

How much do the ice-creams cost?

How much change do you need?

Can you count the 1 pennies and count in 2's using the 2 pennies.

Can you sort according to weight?

Use words such as: lighter than, heavier than, more than, less than, the same as.

Can you weigh the fruit in the fruit bowl in your hands?

Which is the heaviest apple?

Which is the lightest banana?

Challenge

Can you weigh out the ingredients to make a cake/ biscuits or a crumble?
