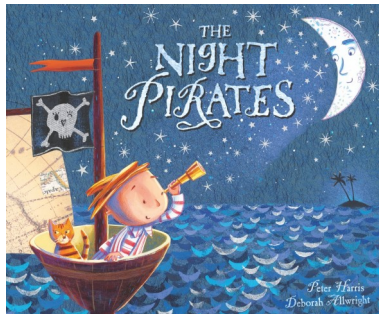

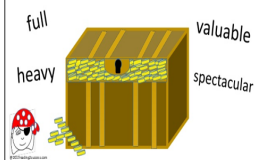

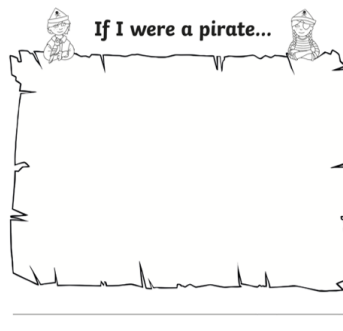

events of the story?

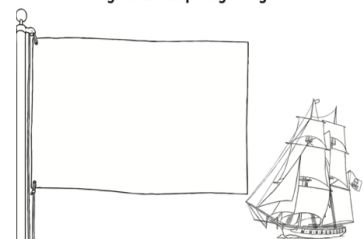
