Watch the video below. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=20f0u8tzS7s All you really need is a spoon, if you don't have the other items, you can improvise and use anything you think will work. Once you have created your catapult make a small ball from paper and use your catapult to fire it. Then measure how far it has gone. Remember the distance and write this on a piece of paper ready for Tuesdays check in.
